


Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities — through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSOT[°], SAT[°], and AP[°] — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in California.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°

In 2014, 477,674 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSQT, compared to 439,984 in 2013 and 394,636 in 2010.

→ 46.6% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 44.6% in 2013 and 41.9% in 2010.



→ Last October, **45.4%** of 10th-graders and **40.8%** of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.²



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SAT

In California, 241,553 or 60.4% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 236,923 students (60.3%) in last year's graduating class and 222,658 (51.7%) in the class of 2011.³

→ 45.9% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 44.1% in 2014 and 39.5% in 2011.




→ 42.1% took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 39.2% in 2014 and 33.6% of the class of 2011.

AP

In California, 370,016 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 352,519 in 2014 and 299,829 in 2011.

→ 38.9% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 38.5% in 2014 and 34.1% in 2011.



→ 34.5% were low-income students, compared to 33.4% in 2014 and 30.4% in 2011.

In California, students took 700,449 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 663,862 in 2014 and 550,988 in 2011.

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

ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT[®]


In California, 84,133 (36.1%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 19.8% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 17.1% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 30.6% of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In California, 90,151 (45.1%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSOT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 28.4% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 23.1% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 39.4% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In California, 61,691 10th-grade


PSAT/NMSOT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 30,533 in an AP STEM subject.

In California, 11,677 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers showed potential for AP success, including 3,406 in an AP STEM subject.

SAT

In California, 99,134 (41.0%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 21.4% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 20.2% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 38.1% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.



AP

In California, 234,257 students scored 3 or higher on an AP° Exam in 2015, compared to 225,931 in 2014 and 190,327 in 2011.

- → 63.3% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 42.6% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 53.1% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 58.0% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
