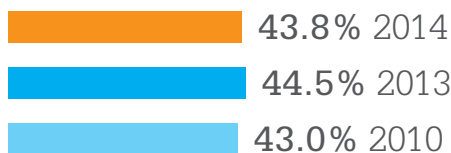
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities — through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT®, SAT®, and AP® — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Florida.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT®

In 2014, 314,092 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSQT, compared to 296,707 in 2013 and 279,053 in 2010.

→ **43.8%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 44.5% in 2013 and 43.0% in 2010.



→ Last October, **78.9%** of 10th-graders and **35.2%** of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.²

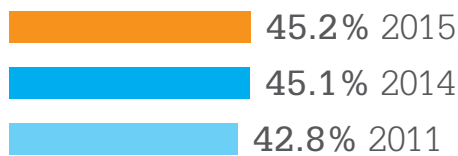

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SAT[®]

In Florida, 122,939 or 74.3% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 115,437 students (72.2%) in last year's graduating class and 114,769 (65.3%) in the class of 2011.³

→ **45.2%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 45.1% in 2014 and 42.8% in 2011.

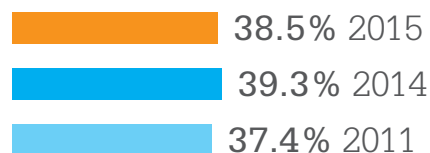


→ **32.1%** took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 31.1% in 2014 and 26.7% of the class of 2011.

AP[®]

In Florida, 200,061 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 196,028 in 2014 and 181,934 in 2011.

→ **38.5%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 39.3% in 2014 and 37.4% in 2011.



→ **26.1%** were low-income students, compared to 26.1% in 2014 and 22.3% in 2011.

In Florida, students took 365,132 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 356,964 in 2014 and 326,341 in 2011.

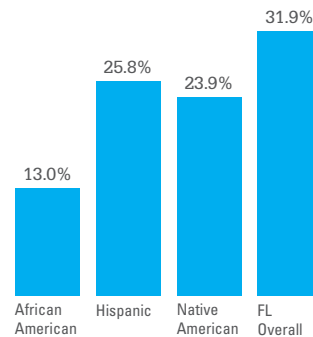

PSAT/NMSQT®

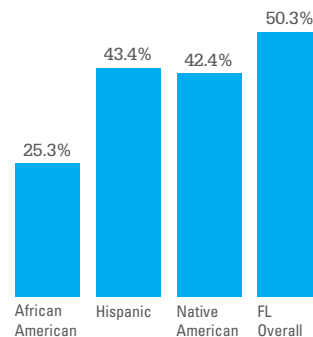
In Florida, 55,125 (31.9%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- **13.0%** of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **25.8%** of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **23.9%** of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Florida, 35,331 (50.3%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- **25.3%** of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **43.4%** of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **42.4%** of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



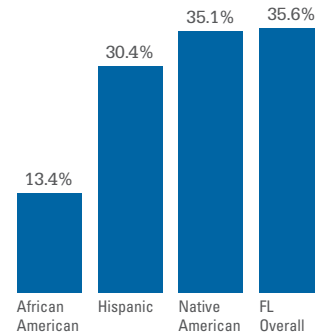
In Florida, 38,267 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 16,107 in an AP STEM subject.

In Florida, 10,296 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers showed potential for AP success, including 3,573 in an AP STEM subject.

SAT[®]

In Florida, 43,763 (35.6%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- **13.4%** of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- **30.4%** of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- **35.1%** of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.



AP[®]

In Florida, 108,793 students scored 3 or higher on an AP[®] Exam in 2015, compared to 103,732 in 2014 and 87,866 in 2011.

- **54.4%** of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- **32.1%** of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- **57.1%** of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- **46.5%** of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
