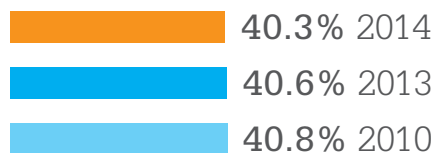
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities — through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT®, SAT®, and AP® — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Georgia.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT®

In 2014, 179,089 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSQT, compared to 179,736 in 2013 and 183,563 in 2010.

→ **40.3%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 40.6% in 2013 and 40.8% in 2010.



→ Last October, **80.6%** of 10th-graders and **28.3%** of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.²

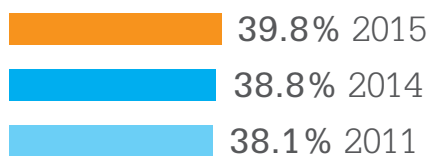

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SAT[®]

In Georgia, 72,898 or 76.9% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 73,626 students (77.2%) in last year's graduating class and 72,510 (75.3%) in the class of 2011.³

→ **39.8%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 38.8% in 2014 and 38.1% in 2011.

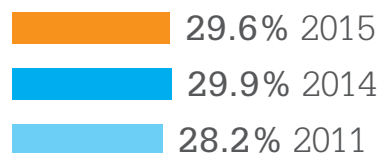


→ **31.6%** took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 27.5% in 2014 and 25.5% of the class of 2011.

AP[®]

In Georgia, 93,208 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 89,806 in 2014 and 72,384 in 2011.

→ **29.6%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 29.9% in 2014 and 28.2% in 2011.



→ **22.3%** were low-income students, compared to 24.3% in 2014 and 19.8% in 2011.

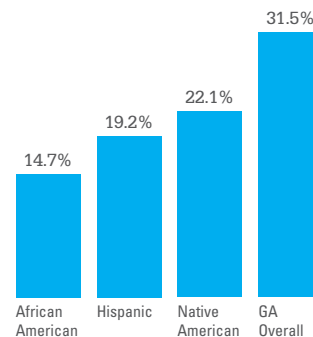
In Georgia, students took 161,863 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 154,176 in 2014 and 120,706 in 2011.

ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT®

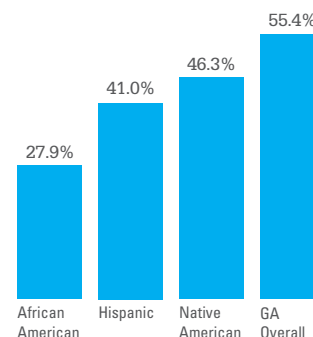
In Georgia, 34,808 (31.5%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- **14.7%** of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **19.2%** of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **22.1%** of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Georgia, 18,508 (55.4%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- **27.9%** of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **41.0%** of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **46.3%** of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



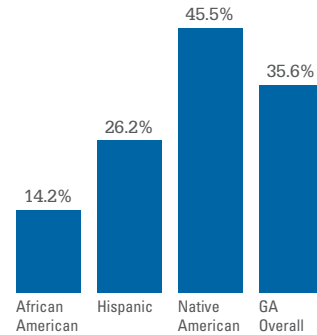
In Georgia, 24,529 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 10,045 in an AP STEM subject.

In Georgia, 4,353 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers showed potential for AP success, including 1,248 in an AP STEM subject.

SAT

In Georgia, 25,975 (35.6%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- **14.2%** of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- **26.2%** of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- **45.5%** of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.



AP

In Georgia, 53,222 students scored 3 or higher on an AP[®] Exam in 2015, compared to 50,507 in 2014 and 39,492 in 2011.

- **57.1%** of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- **30.6%** of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- **50.1%** of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- **55.2%** of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
