
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities — through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSOT[°], SAT[°], and AP[°] — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Idaho.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°

In 2014, 26,706 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSQT, compared to 27,399 in 2013 and 8,585 in 2010.

→ 14.7% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 14.9% in 2013 and 9.3% in 2010.



→ Last October, **78.1%** of 10th-graders and **34.6%** of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.²

SAT

In Idaho, 17,695 or 99.9% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 18,078 students (100.0%) in last year's graduating class and 3,557 (19.9%) in the class of 2011.³

→ 11.8% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 15.1% in 2014 and 8.6% in 2011.



AP

In Idaho, 6,151 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 5,664 in 2014 and 4,998 in 2011.

→ 9.6% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 8.7% in 2014 and 6.5% in 2011.

In Idaho, students took 10,442 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 9,556 in 2014 and 8,584 in 2011.



PSAT/NMSQT°


In Idaho, 6,616 (36.8%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT $^{\circ}$ takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 18.6% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 13.9% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 20.5% of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Idaho, 3,908 (53.7%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSOT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 27.7% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 32.4% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 34.4% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Idaho, 4,562 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT


takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 1,673 in an AP STEM subject.

In Idaho, 252 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers showed potential for AP success, including 68 in an AP STEM subject.

SAT

In Idaho, 4,624 (26.1%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 14.9% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 11.9% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 12.4% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.



AP

In Idaho, 4,016 students scored 3 or higher on an AP[®] Exam in 2015, compared to 3,824 in 2014 and 3,446 in 2011.

- → 65.3% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 38.6% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 47.3% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 44.2% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
