



📑 Massachusetts

Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT°, SAT°, and AP° — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Massachusetts.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°

In 2014, 105,027 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSOT, compared to 101,891 in 2013 and 92,716 in 2010.

→ 19.7% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 18.5% in 2013 and 16.8% in 2010.

→ Last October, 54.7% of 10th-graders and 71.5% of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.2


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SAT

In Massachusetts, 61,277 or 86.2% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 60,451 students (84.1%) in last year's graduating class and 61,813 (82.7%) in the class of 2011.3

→ 18.2% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 17.1% in 2014 and 15.6% in 2011.



→ 22.0% took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 20.2% in 2014 and 18.7% of the class of 2011.



In Massachusetts, 59,105 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 55,656 in 2014 and 44,912 in 2011.

- → 12.9% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 12.6% in 2014 and 10.7% in 2011.
 - **12.9**% 2015
 - **12.6**% 2014
 - **10.7%** 2011
- → 17.0% were low-income students, compared to 14.5% in 2014 and 12.5% in 2011.

In Massachusetts, students took 107,925 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 100,493 in 2014 and 79,130 in 2011.




ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°


In Massachusetts, 21,968 (49.8%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 24.8% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 18.2% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 30.8% of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Massachusetts, 29,821 (52.9%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 23.4% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 20.3% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 33.3% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Massachusetts, 16,467 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 8,566 in an AP STEM subject.


In Massachusetts, 1,172 underrepresented minority 10thgrade PSAT/NMSQT takers showed potential for AP success, including 459 in an AP STEM subject.



SAT

In Massachusetts, 30,738 (50.2%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 19.7% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 22.0% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 32.1% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.





In Massachusetts, 41,796 students scored 3 or higher on an AP® Exam in 2015, compared to 40,071 in 2014 and 32,580 in 2011.

- → 70.7% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 42.2% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 52.5% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 55.8% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
