

# Maryland


Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT°, SAT°, and AP° — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Maryland.<sup>1</sup>

#### ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

### PSAT/NMSQT°

In 2014, 123,975 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSOT, compared to 123,139 in 2013 and 127,785 in 2010.

→ 38.7% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 36.8% in 2013 and 34.9% in 2010.



→ Last October, 80.9% of 10th-graders and 66.7% of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.2


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#### SAT

In Maryland, 48,845 or 78.7% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 49,665 students (78.5%) in last year's graduating class and 47,787 (71.3%) in the class of 2011.3

→ 40.7% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 39.8% in 2014 and 37.0% in 2011.




→ 17.6% took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 15.3% in 2014 and 15.4% of the class of 2011.



In Maryland, 65,109 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 66,034 in 2014 and 59,617 in 2011.

→ 26.3% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 27.1% in 2014 and 24.8% in 2011.



→ 13.5% were low-income students, compared to 13.2% in 2014 and 12.1% in 2011.

In Maryland, students took 122,971 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 124,096 in 2014 and 110,641 in 2011.




#### ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

### PSAT/NMSQT°


In Maryland, 21,688 (37.8%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 17.6% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 20.0% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 22.8% of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Maryland, 20,547 (46.2%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSOT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 21.5% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 32.9% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 35.1% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Maryland, 16,195 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 7,820 in an AP STEM subject.


In Maryland, 2,645 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers showed potential for AP success, including 809 in an AP STEM subject.



## SAT

In Maryland, 19,803 (40.5%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 16.1% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 27.4% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 26.7% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.





In Maryland, 40,983 students scored 3 or higher on an AP® Exam in 2015, compared to 41,618 in 2014 and 36,574 in 2011.

- → 62.9% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 36.3% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 58.5% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 51.5% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
