
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT°, SAT°, and AP° — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in New Jersey.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT[®]

In 2014, 177,175 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSOT, compared to 166,044 in 2013 and 138,422 in 2010.

→ 30.4% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 29.0% in 2013 and 25.5% in 2010.



→ Last October, 68.7% of 10th-graders and 75.9% of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.2


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SAT

In New Jersey, 85,021 or 81.4% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 83,431 students (79.3%) in last year's graduating class and 86,515 (78.6%) in the class of 2011.3

→ 30.6% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 29.4% in 2014 and 26.7% in 2011.




→ 22.4% took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 20.5% in 2014 and 17.1% of the class of 2011.



In New Jersey, 66,956 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 62,534 in 2014 and 51,469 in 2011.

→ 18.4% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 18.8% in 2014 and 14.8% in 2011.



→ 10.7% were low-income students, compared to 10.5% in 2014 and 7.6% in 2011.

In New Jersey, students took 129,982 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 119,049 in 2014 and 95,590 in 2011.




ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°


In New Jersey, 34,557 (44.3%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 19.8% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 21.4% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 29.3% of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In New Jersey, 37,211 (45.1%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 19.7% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 22.9% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 34.2% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In New Jersey, 25,231 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 12,464 in an AP STEM subject.


In New Jersey, 2,813 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers showed potential for AP success, including 997 in an AP STEM subject.



SAT

In New Jersey, 38,691 (45.5%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 17.1% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 23.8% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 35.0% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.





In New Jersey, 48,673 students scored 3 or higher on an AP® Exam in 2015, compared to 46,279 in 2014 and 38,305 in 2011.

- → 72.7% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 46.0% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 57.6% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 68.5% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
