
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT°, SAT°, and AP° — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Nevada.1

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT[®]

In 2014, 37,449 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSOT, compared to 33,156 in 2013 and 35,802 in 2010.

→ 41.4% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 41.1% in 2013 and 37.2% in 2010.



→ Last October, 80.6% of 10th-graders and 27.0% of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.2



SAT

In Nevada, 11,487 or 49.8% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 11,663 students (54.2%) in last year's graduating class and 10,391 (41.5%) in the class of 2011.3

→ 36.5% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 35.4% in 2014 and 29.8% in 2011.




→ 30.1% took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 24.8% in 2014 and 16.6% of the class of 2011.



In Nevada, 17,423 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 15,607 in 2014 and 11,996 in 2011.

→ 31.6% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 30.8% in 2014 and 27.1% in 2011.



→ 27.3% were low-income students, compared to 25.2% in 2014 and 23.5% in 2011.

In Nevada, students took 31,449 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 27,473 in 2014 and 20,908 in 2011.




ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°

In Nevada, 7,164 (25.5%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.


- → 12.3% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 12.2% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.





In Nevada, 4,199 (51.8%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT° takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 32.3% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 32.8% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 46.3% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Nevada, 4,598 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 1,699 in an AP STEM subject.


In Nevada, 836 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers showed potential for AP success, including 208 in an AP STEM subject.



SAT

In Nevada, 4,122 (35.9%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 16.4% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 21.3% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 33.3% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.





In Nevada, 9,569 students scored 3 or higher on an AP® Exam in 2015, compared to 8,593 in 2014 and 6,214 in 2011.

- → 54.9% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 38.6% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 45.3% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 48.9% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
