
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT°, SAT°, and AP° — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSOT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in South Carolina.1

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT[®]

In 2014, 85,757 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSOT, compared to 66,860 in 2013 and 70,081 in 2010.

→ 30.8% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 26.9% in 2013 and 27.6% in 2010.



→ Last October, 68.6% of 10th-graders and 36.2% of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.2


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SAT

In South Carolina, 26,336 or 65.4% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 26,002 students (64.9%) in last year's graduating class and 26,452 (62.9%) in the class of 2011.3

→ 30.8% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 30.0% in 2014 and 30.8% in 2011.




→ 26.7% took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 25.1% in 2014 and 23.8% of the class of 2011.



In South Carolina, 28,987 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 27,655 in 2014 and 20,684 in 2011.

→ 18.4% were underrepresented minority students, compared to 18.1% in 2014 and 16.2% in 2011.



→ 14.3% were low-income students, compared to 13.6% in 2014 and 11.6% in 2011.

In South Carolina, students took 46,341 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 43,968 in 2014 and 34,476 in 2011.




ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT°


In South Carolina, 12,294 (30.7%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 9.8% of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 19.7% of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 17.9% of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In South Carolina, 8,303 (45.9%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT[®] takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- → 15.0% of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 38.4% of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- → 30.9% of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In South Carolina, 8,462 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 3,143 in an AP STEM subject.


In South Carolina, 888 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSOT takers showed potential for AP success, including 223 in an AP STEM subject.



SAT

In South Carolina, 9,310 (35.4%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- → 9.3% of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 29.5% of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- → 32.6% of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.





In South Carolina, 17,173 students scored 3 or higher on an AP® Exam in 2015, compared to 16,162 in 2014 and 12,297 in 2011.

- → 59.2% of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- → 31.3% of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 51.4% of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- → 57.4% of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
