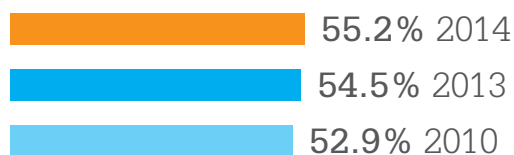
Increasing the number of students who graduate from high school ready for college and career is a unifying priority for educators from every state. The College Board believes that its programs can be a platform to expand access to opportunities — through scholarships, challenging course work, fee waivers, and much more — and to propel students into college and career. Our programs — PSAT/NMSQT®, SAT®, and AP® — work together to provide actionable results, drive instructional next steps for individual students, and provide targeted policies for states and districts. Below is a summary of the 2014-15 PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, and AP participation and performance results in Texas.¹

ALL SCHOOLS' PARTICIPATION RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT®

In 2014, 572,586 students benefited from taking the PSAT/NMSQT, compared to 532,198 in 2013 and 515,725 in 2010.

→ **55.2%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 54.5% in 2013 and 52.9% in 2010.



→ Last October, **68.7%** of 10th-graders and **66.1%** of 11th-graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.²

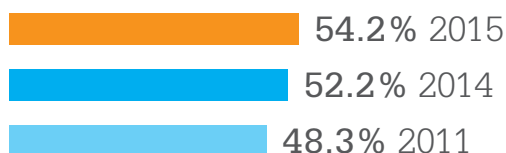

SAT[®]

In Texas, 193,768 or 64.3% of students from the class of 2015 took the SAT, compared to 179,036 students (62.0%) in last year's graduating class and 166,012 (56.9%) in the class of 2011.³

→ **54.2%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 52.2% in 2014 and 48.3% in 2011.

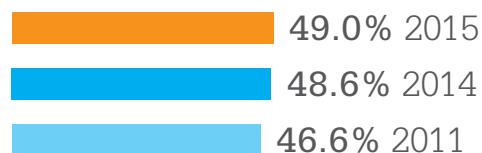


→ **30.4%** took the test using a fee waiver, compared to 32.3% in 2014 and 31.6% of the class of 2011.

AP[®]

In Texas, 268,918 students took an AP Exam in 2015, compared to 238,161 in 2014 and 198,272 in 2011.

→ **49.0%** were underrepresented minority students, compared to 48.6% in 2014 and 46.6% in 2011.



→ **41.5%** were low-income students, compared to 41.3% in 2014 and 31.8% in 2011.

In Texas, students took 505,790 AP Exams in 2015, compared to 434,001 in 2014 and 360,735 in 2011.

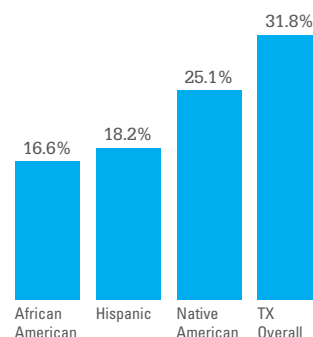

ALL SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE RESULTS

PSAT/NMSQT®

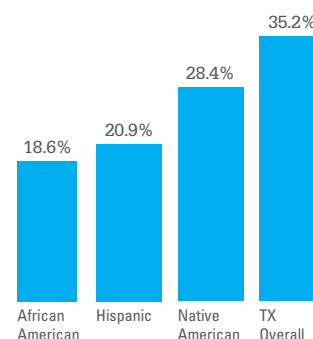
In Texas, 83,471 (31.8%) 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- **16.6%** of 10th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **18.2%** of 10th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **25.1%** of 10th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



In Texas, 79,977 (35.2%) 11th-grade PSAT/NMSQT® takers in 2014 were on track for college readiness.

- **18.6%** of 11th-grade African American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **20.9%** of 11th-grade Hispanic PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.
- **28.4%** of 11th-grade Native American PSAT/NMSQT takers met the benchmark.



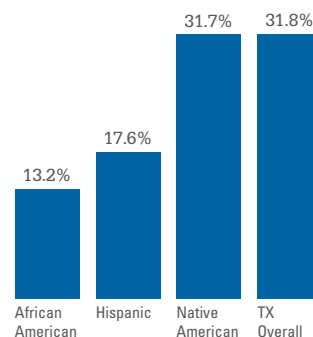
In Texas, 57,522 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers in 2014 demonstrated potential to succeed in at least one AP course, including 24,233 in an AP STEM subject.

In Texas, 14,974 underrepresented minority 10th-grade PSAT/NMSQT takers showed potential for AP success, including 4,486 in an AP STEM subject.

SAT

In Texas, 61,684 (31.8%) SAT takers in the class of 2015 met the SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

- **13.2%** of African American SAT takers met the benchmark.
- **17.6%** of Hispanic SAT takers met the benchmark.
- **31.7%** of Native American SAT takers met the benchmark.



AP

In Texas, 133,553 students scored 3 or higher on an AP® Exam in 2015, compared to 123,988 in 2014 and 96,161 in 2011.

- **49.7%** of AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam in May 2015.
- **28.0%** of African American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- **40.4%** of Hispanic AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
- **47.3%** of Native American AP Exam takers scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam.
