The SAT

The SAT[®] is a globally available test accepted by all U.S. and many international colleges and universities. It is offered at least seven times a year in the United States and U.S. territories, and up to six times a year internationally. Visit sat.org to learn more.

SAT Subject Tests

The SAT Subject Tests[™] are hour-long, content-based tests that let students distinguish themselves in the college admission process by highlighting their strengths and interests in specific subject areas, including math, science, history, literature, and languages. Fee Waivers

Eligible students who demonstrate financial need can receive up to two fee waivers for SAT registrations and up to two fee waivers for SAT Subject Test registrations (three Subject Tests allowed per registration). The waivers cover registration fees, additional score reports (four for each student), and college application fee waivers (four for each student).

PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT™ 10, and PSAT™ 8/9

The PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10

The PSAT/NMSQT® and PSAT™ 10 are the same test, offered at different times of year. Part of the SAT Suite of Assessments and tightly aligned with the SAT, they serve as check-ins on student progress and pinpoint areas for development.

The PSAT/NMSQT is offered to 10th- and 11th-graders in the fall. Instead of delivering the PSAT/NMSQT to 10th-graders in the fall, some schools may deliver the PSAT 10 in the spring.

Both tests will support all students with a clear focus on the skills and knowledge that matter most for college and career success.

The PSAT 8/9

The PSAT™ 8/9 is the first test in the SAT Suite of Assessments. Using the same specifications as the SAT, the PSAT/NMSQT, and the PSAT 10, it establishes a baseline for college and career readiness as students enter high school. The PSAT 8/9 is designed for eighth- and ninth-graders.

Practice for PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10

To get ready for the PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10, students can visit collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt-psat-10/practice for a full practice test and sample questions. There's also a full practice test in the *PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide*.

Because the PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10 follow the same assessment design principles as the SAT, students can also use Khan Academy's free personalized SAT practice resources at satpractice.org to get ready for the tests.

The Advanced Placement Program (AP) gives high school students the opportunity to study and learn at the college level, with 38 courses and exams in a wide variety of subject areas. Nearly all colleges and universities in the United States — as well as many institutions in more than 60 other countries — grant credit and placement for AP scores or acknowledge AP scores in the admission process.

Fee Reductions

The College Board provides a \$31 fee reduction per exam for students with financial need. Schools are expected to forgo their \$9 rebate for these students, resulting in a cost of \$53 per exam. Many states use federal and state funding to further reduce the exam fee for these students.

September	Schools receive annual participation materials. Schools complete their participation materials and designate their AP Coordinators.
October	Oct. 15: Preferred date by which administrators should renew previously authorized courses for the 2016-17 school year.
November	AP Course Ledger of authorized 2016-17 AP courses available on the web. 2016 State and National Summary Reports are posted on collegeboard.org. Nov. 15: Deadline for schools to return the AP Participation Form and survey.
December	The <i>AP Coordinator's Manual</i> is sent to schools.

January	Schools receive exam ordering information and can begin ordering exams online. Jan. 31: AP Course Audit deadline for new course submissions and renewal of previously authorized courses for 2016-17.
February	Feb. 1: Deadline for College Board Summer Institute grant applications. Feb 17: SSD accommodations requests deadline
March	See the <i>AP Coordinator's Manual</i> or collegeboard.org for AP Exam ordering deadlines. Schools may begin submitting AP Course Audit materials for the 2017-18 school year.
April	Schools receive exam materials.
May	AP Exams are administered. May 1–5, 8–12: Regular testing period. May 17–19: Late-testing period.
June	June 1: Deadline for AP Services to receive all exam materials. June 15: Postmark deadline for exam payments and invoices submitted to AP Services. Late payments incur a \$225 fee.
July	AP score reports are provided to students, high schools, and colleges.
August	School administrators may begin renewing previously authorized courses for the 2017-18 school year.

All testing accommodations must be approved by the College Board SSD office prior to the test. Schools can use SSD Online to request, manage, and track accommodation requests. The accommodation approval process takes **approximately seven weeks**. To ensure enough time to process your students' requests, accommodation requests should be submitted as early as possible. ACCUPLACER is a suite of computer-adaptive diagnostic and placement tests that quickly and efficiently assesses students' reading, writing, and math skills. Teachers and counselors can use the results of these assessments to determine students' strengths and weaknesses and provide early academic intervention. Colleges can use ACCUPLACER to place students into appropriate courses in which they can confidently meet classroom requirements. Placement and diagnostic exams are offered in Reading, Writing, Math, and ESL. A Computer Skill Placement test is also available.

CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE® is a fully online service that helps colleges and organizations award their institutional student aid funds. PROFILE is required or accepted by nearly 300 colleges, universities, and scholarship programs.

Note that a PROFILE account is required to complete the PROFILE. Once students create an account, they can complete and submit the application at any time. Once submitted, the PROFILE report is sent to the designated colleges or programs.

PROFILE fees for up to eight colleges are waived for first-year, first-time domestic students from low-income backgrounds. Students who used an SAT fee waiver may also qualify for up to eight PROFILE fee waivers. Students who took the SAT with a fee waiver should log into PROFILE using the same credentials used for the SAT.
