The SAT

The SAT® is a forward-looking test that upholds a high level of academic excellence, helping prepare students to compete in a 21st-century global economy by testing skills required for college and beyond. As a curriculum-based, high-stakes test, the SAT provides educators with an important measure of academic achievement as students prepare for postsecondary college and career opportunities. The SAT was created to widen access to higher education, and it continues to do so today. Because courses and grading standards vary widely from school to school, scores on the SAT, along with other criteria like high school GPA, help colleges predict a student's ability to succeed in college. SAT SUBJECT TESTS

The SAT Subject Tests™ are one-hour-long, content-based tests that give students an opportunity to highlight their academic background and interests in specific subject areas, including math, science, history, literature and languages. FEE WAIVERS

Eligible college-aspiring students who demonstrate financial need can receive up to two fee waivers for SAT registrations and up to two fee waivers for SAT Subject Test registrations (three Subject Tests allowed per registration). In addition to test fees, the waivers can be used for discounts on materials to get ready for test day, and certain colleges may also waive application fees.

The Advanced Placement Program® (AP) provides high school students with the opportunity to study and learn at the college level, with 34 courses and exams in a wide variety of subject areas. AP is accepted by most two- and four-year colleges and universities worldwide for college credit, advanced placement or both on the basis of successful exam scores. This includes colleges and universities in more than 60 countries around the world.

FEE REDUCTIONS

The College Board provides a \$22 fee reduction per exam for students with financial need. Schools are expected to forgo their \$8 rebate for these students, resulting in a cost of \$57 per exam. Through federal grants, most states supplement this discount by amounts up to the rest of the exam fee.

September	Schools receive annual participation materials.
October	Schools complete their participation materials and designate their AP Coordinators. Oct. 15: Preferred date by which administrators should renew previously authorized courses for the 2011-12 school year.
November	AP Course Ledger of authorized 2011-12 AP courses available on the Web. 2011 State and National Summary Reports are posted on collegeboard.org. Nov. 15: Deadline for schools to return the AP Participation Form.
December	The 2011-12 <i>AP Coordinator's Manual</i> is sent to schools.
2012	
January	Schools receive exam ordering information and can begin ordering exams online. Jan. 31: AP Course Audit deadline for new course submissions and renewal of previously authorized courses for 2011-12.
February	Feb. 15: Postmark deadline for College Board AP Fellows grant applications.
March	See the <i>AP Coordinator's Manual</i> or collegeboard.org for AP Exam ordering deadlines. Schools may begin submitting AP Course Audit materials for the 2012-13 school year.
April	Schools receive exam materials.
May	AP Exams are administered. May 7-11, 14-18: Regular testing period. May 23-25: Late-testing period.
June	June 1: Preferred date to submit AP Course Audit materials for new courses. June 1: Deadline for AP Services to receive all exam materials. June 15: Postmark deadline for AP Services to receive exam payment. Late payments incur a \$200 fee.
July	AP score reports are provided to students, high schools and colleges.
August	School administrators may begin renewing previously authorized courses for the 2012-13 school year.
