

WHAT MAKES A SCHOOL AN:

ACADEMIC REACH

Your SAT[®] score falls **below the middle 50%** or the college **accepts less than 20% of applicants** each year.

ACADEMIC FIT

Your SAT score falls within the middle 50%.

ACADEMIC SAFETY

Your SAT score falls above the middle 50%.

NOTE: Your chances of admission depend on your SAT scores, GPA, other achievements, how many students apply, and how many a college admits. You'll also want to consider if a college seems like a good fit for you personally and socially.

Steps	When to do it
Review your personalized starter college list on the page with: 🔳	Now
 Consider what's important to you while exploring colleges: location, size, majors, student organizations, and support programs. Pick at least 6 colleges and add them to your application list. Explore colleges at bigfuture.org. 	NEXT
Check each college's website to confirm the admission and financial aid deadlines. Some colleges may have earlier deadlines for scholarships, specific majors, and housing choices.	September
Share your college application list with your school counselor or teacher and ask for their feedback.	September
Ask your school counselor how to have transcripts sent to the colleges on your list and follow their instructions.	September
Write first drafts of essays and ask teachers and others to review them.	September
Ask your school counselor or teacher for recommendation letters. Provide an outline of your academic record and your extracurricular activities.	September
Visit fafsa.ed.gov to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and send it to every school on your application list.	October



- majors



- 1 academic safety college
