

Four-Year Graduation Rates and Pell Representation for Four-Year Colleges

A college's average graduation rate is a very important characteristic to consider when deciding which college to apply to and attend. **If the college's students normally graduate on time, you are also more likely to graduate on time.**

You should also consider other aspects of a college, including diversity of the student body. The percentage of undergraduate students receiving Pell Grants (federal grants for students with financial need) is one measure of the socioeconomic diversity at a given college.
