

## Maine 2024 AP School Honor Roll Recognition











The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening access.

The AP School Honor Roll, which replaces the previous AP District Honor Roll, offers schools recognition across four levels of distinction: Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Platinum. Schools on the AP School Honor Roll may also earn the AP Access Award, honoring schools that demonstrate a clear and effective commitment to equitable access to advanced coursework.

For a school to be recognized on the AP School Honor Roll, it must be located within the United States (including U.S. territories) or Canada and:

- Meet each of the following criteria anchored in research-based relationships between AP and college outcomes:
  - College Culture: 40% or more of graduating cohort took at least 1 AP Exam during high school.
  - College Credit: 25% or more of the graduating cohort scored a 3 or higher on at least 1 AP Exam during high school.
  - College Optimization: 2% or more of the graduating cohort took 5 or more AP Exams during high school. At least 1 of those exams was taken in 9th or 10th grade, so that students are spreading their AP experience across grades rather than feeling disproportionate pressure in any single year.
- Have full-time grade-12 enrollments. AP coordinators can update this information online in AP Registration and Ordering.

## As of October 2024, in Maine

Of 110 qualifying schools, 17% earned a place on the 2024 AP School Honor Roll.<sup>1</sup>

Schools can see AP School Honor Roll status in **AP Score Reports for Educators**. Recognized schools will have access to download a custom celebration kit.

There is no annual application process for schools to be considered for recognition.
