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# Order Everything in One Place

Order the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 for the 2019-20 school year at [ordering.collegeboard.org](https://ordering.collegeboard.org). You can administer multiple tests at the same time. And now any school can choose the digital PSAT 8/9, the first digital test in the SAT Suite of Assessments offered to all schools.

### Sign Up—Sign In—Order

Test coordinators need two things:

1. An account at [ordering.collegeboard.org](https://ordering.collegeboard.org). If you used the site last year, sign in to your account with the same username and password. If this is your first time registering, sign up for an account.
2. Your school and access codes.

### CHOOSE THE DIGITAL PSAT 8/9

Your school can give the PSAT 8/9 digitally or on paper. Either way, students take the same test and get the same feedback. The testing periods are also the same but deadlines and other dates may differ. (The digital PSAT 8/9 is available only to U.S. schools at this time.)

### RECEIVE MATERIALS EARLY

Save time by letting students fill out their identifying information before test day—choose the preadministration option at [ordering.collegeboard.org](https://ordering.collegeboard.org). Preadministration materials are sent automatically for SAT® School Day and can be requested for PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT™ 10, and PSAT™ 8/9.

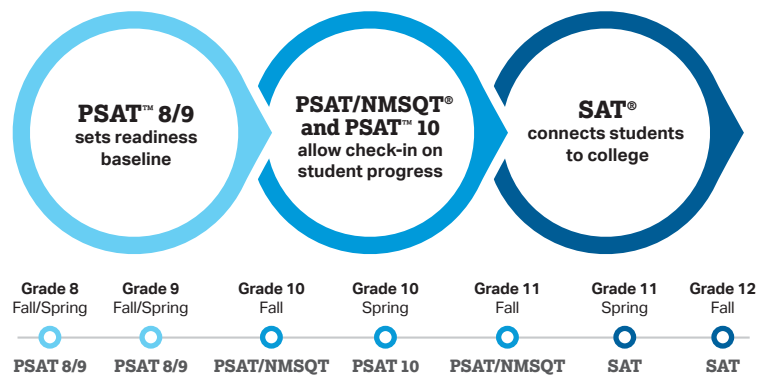

## SAT School Day

SAT School Day allows states, districts, and schools to offer the SAT to juniors (spring testing only) and seniors (fall testing only) during a weekday in their own school, expanding access to this globally recognized college admission test that's accepted at all U.S. colleges. From flexible ordering options to implementation tools, College Board makes it easy for your school or district to administer.

## PSAT/NMSQT

### Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

The 2019 PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying test students take to enter the National Merit® Scholarship Program and to compete for recognition and college scholarships to be awarded in 2021. (See further information under "Benefits.")

## PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9

The PSAT 8/9 sets a readiness baseline, and the PSAT 10 serves as a "check-in" on progress, allowing students and teachers to pinpoint areas for focused practice as students progress through high school. The PSAT 10 covers the same content areas as the PSAT/NMSQT. For both the PSAT 10 and the PSAT 8/9, schools may test on any weekday during the testing periods.

The SAT Suite of Assessments focuses on the skills and knowledge needed for college and career readiness, reflects what students are already learning in their classrooms, and provides benchmarks for assessing students' progress as they enter and move through high school.

The SAT Suite of Assessments offers unparalleled benefits to states, districts, schools, and students by:

- **Setting Benchmarks:** Uses a common score scale for a clear baseline to measure progress from year to year and focuses on areas where students need support so educators can quickly intervene.
- **Opening AP Opportunities:** Identifies students likely to succeed in AP. When students do well in AP courses, they're more likely to succeed in college. Also, students with qualifying AP Exam scores can save money through credit-granting and placement policies.
- **Increasing Access to Opportunities:** Lets schools and districts administer the SAT, and any of the assessments, during the school day. Students can take tests without worrying about weekend conflicts, jobs, or other obligations.
- **Providing Actionable Data:** Delivers valuable data in one online score reporting portal. ## National Merit Scholarship Program

To enter the National Merit Scholarship Program, which is conducted by National Merit Scholarship Corporation, students must take the PSAT/NMSQT in the specified year of their high school program (usually the junior year) and meet other published participation requirements.

You can find information about the program, entry requirements, and scholarships to be offered in 2021 in the *Guide to the National Merit Scholarship Program* (for educators), on NMSC's website at [www.nationalmerit.org](https://www.nationalmerit.org), and in the 2019 *PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide*, delivered to schools this fall.

**Note:** The PSAT/NMSQT is the official route of entry to the National Merit Scholarship Program. SAT School Day, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 are **not** considered for entry to the program.

More than \$255 million in additional scholarships is available for qualified students who take the PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10. # Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD)

## Test with Accommodations

Accommodated test formats, such as large print, braille, and extended time, are available for SAT School Day, the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 for students who require accommodations due to a disability.

All accommodations for SAT School Day, PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10 must be approved by College Board before test day. College Board doesn't need to review accommodations for PSAT 8/9—the student's school determines these accommodations.

### Scores

October SAT School Day scores are available first to educators and then to students on [k12reports.collegeboard.org](https://k12reports.collegeboard.org) soon after testing. Some essay scores may be posted later. (Scores for seniors aren't guaranteed to arrive in time for college early admission deadlines.)

PSAT/NMSQT scores are released to [k12reports.collegeboard.org](https://k12reports.collegeboard.org) for educators; paper reports and student reports follow shortly afterward. For PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9, the availability of online scores and interpretive materials will depend on when schools return the answer sheets. Paper score reports will be mailed soon after online scores are available.
